Erick Otia Okoth, also known as Amuka Sasa, is a Kenyan-born artist and peace advocate based in Switzerland.

His work focuses on youth empowerment, cultural identity, and community dialogue through music and civic engagement.

His peace engagement began during the 2007–2008 post-election crisis in Kenya, where he used music to encourage young people

to reject violence and support dialogue and peaceful coexistence.

In 2010, he co-founded the Bit4Peace Initiative with Joël Hakizimana, promoting unity and leadership through music and community mobilization.

This contributed to the establishment of ADYNE Switzerland in 2011, now a recognized platform for African diaspora youth engagement.

Today, as Ambassador for Peace and President of ADYNE Switzerland, Erick continues to support intercultural dialogue and youth participation.

Through RECOVI and collaboration with CIRID within the United Nations ECOSOC consultative framework, he engages in civil society diplomacy and

international cooperation.
